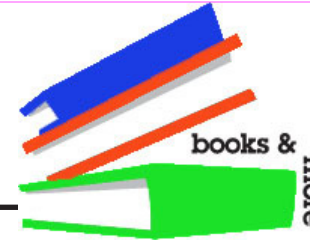

- Updated the library website
